PARTS OF SPEECH – ADJECTIVE COMPARISON

1. ^a [The ^I anxious ^b ~~cry~~ (of the lambs) ^c was answered (by the deeper calls (of the ewes)).]

This is a simple, declarative sentence.

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This is a compound, declarative sentence.
